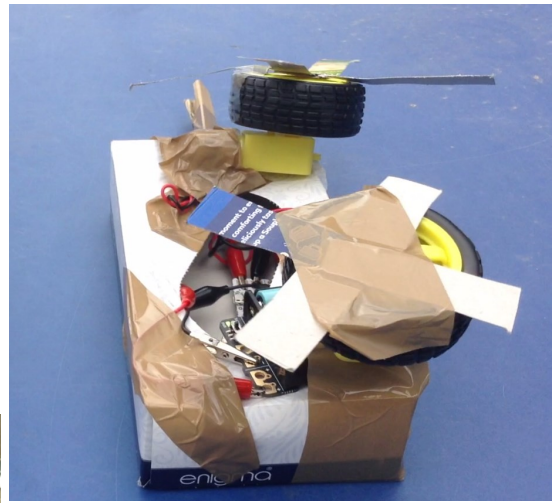


## Year 6 Leavers' picnic
